



Community Action Volunteer! Start where you are. Use what you have. Do what you can Arthur Ashe



October and November brought the start of our Community Action volunteer program for this year. We are happy to say that we have been able to meet some of the volunteer needs listed below. Our volunteers are enjoying getting to know the students and the most-appreciative staff at all of our volunteer sites. However, we are still in need of volunteers, particularly in the Art Masterpiece and Junior Achievement programs. Please contact us if you are interested in volunteering in your community. We need your help.

<u>6-minute reading Program (San Marcos)</u>: Volunteers work individually with a small number of students, in grade 2 to improve their reading fluency and comprehension. This is a well organized, easy-to-implement program. **Commitment: 1 day per week for 1 hour (9:30-10:30 grade 2).**

<u>Work Room (San Marcos)</u>: Volunteers will complete various clerical tasks such as copying, collating, cutting and laminating for teachers and staff. **Commitment: As your schedule allows 1x per week to 1x per month, 1-2 hours.** <u>After School Program (San Marcos)</u>: Volunteers work with approximately 10 students during the 45 minutes between the end of the school day and the start of the after school sports program. This is the perfect time to share your talent and interests with students and have a great time. **Commitment: 1 x per week, 45 minutes**

<u>Art Masterpiece (San Marcos and Other Chandler Schools)</u>: is an elementary program designed to increase a student's awareness of art and art history rather than the technique of creating art. A background in art is not necessary. Volunteers present six prepared lessons during the school year. All lessons, materials and training are provided. **Commitment: 1 day per month (November-April) for 1 hour.**

<u>Junior Achievement (Chandler Schools)</u> is a program designed to inspire and prepare young people to succeed in a global economy. Volunteers present six prepared lessons during the school year. All materials and training are provided for each grade level. Commitment: 1 day per month (November- April) or 1 hour. Contact us anytime to let us know your interests or ask any questions.

Celebrating the 1965 Voting Rights Act: Gains, Losses and Next Steps

"The vote is precious, almost sacred and the most effective non-violent means to impact change." – Warren Stewart Sr.

The 2015 Fall Forum was a collaborative series of events, including a film festival and voter registration, over three days, October 29-31, 2015 . AAUW-AZ with an assist from ASU West and LWV-AZ, celebrated the 1965 Voting Right Act, evaluated changes to voting rights over the years, and dialogued with DREAMers about challenges they face to-day.
