





Follow up from November 21 Branch Meeting







Carol Maas, Maricopa County Deputy Registrar, presented on voter registration and awareness.

Topics related to voting in Arizona were the focus during the November presentation and included:

- · Who can vote in Arizona state and federal requirements, ·Voter registration how and where to register, voter status, and what it means when you might be "inactive" on the voter files,
- ·Updating your voter registration how and where to do it,
- · How/where a voter can vote in Arizona polls, vote centers, early ballot, mail ballot (absentee),
- · Types of elections for various jurisdictions, i.e., city, school board bonds and overrides or state and federal offices.

At our November meeting, Carol Maas, the guest speaker, informed us about the registration and voting processes and regulations applicable in Arizona.

We learned that to vote in a primary, you must be registered with a specific party. As Independents are not a party, there is no primary at which a candidate can be selected to represent Independents in a general election.

The Democrat and Republican parties are the major registered parties in Arizona, but there are also smaller parties that have met the criteria necessary to hold primaries.

The process of registering to vote can be simple or complicated. You can register easily when you renew your



driver's license. If you need to register or to correct your registered address, there are specific timelines with which you must comply.

If your ballot is sent to a previous address, it will not be forwarded to your current address. If you have chosen to vote with a mail-in ballot, you can easily track it online to see when it has been received and recorded. Signing your ballot on the outside of the return envelope makes it possible to compare and verify your signature to confirm the legitimacy of your ballet. Putting your phone number on the envelope makes it possible to contact you if there is any question regarding your signature.

Ms. Maas's wealth of knowledge on the the subject was helpful in answering numerous questions from those attending.




