### Arizona AAUW Legislative Day

Seven women from our AAUW chapter attended the Arizona AAUW Day at the Capitol February 21, 2024. The AAUW State President, Becky Gunn, opened the meeting. Adrian Fontes, Arizona Secretary of State, then welcomed us to the Capitol and gave a brief history of the building. He stressed the need for everyone to recognize and appreciate the humanity in others, especially those with whom we disagree. He answered a variety of questions related to his role as Secretary.

Following Fontes, there were presentations by two members of Governor Hobbs's Administration: Sarah Brown, Director of Strategic Planning and Budget, and Zaida Dedolph-Piecoro, Health and Human Services Policy Advisor. They discussed Governor Hobbs's proposed budget including, but not limited to, health care (licensing reform, rating systems), housing initiatives (tax credits, mortgage assistance), child care (caregivers, employment), and education (enrollment, facilities, future investments).

Brahm Resnik, an anchor, reporter, and the host of "Sunday Square-Off" on channel 12, followed with a brief history of his life. Born in Canada, he moved to the US where he established his career. Several years later he became a citizen, an emotional event he ranks equal to the day of his marriage and the births of his children. Resnik shared several anecdotes related to interviewing politicians and attending decision-making sessions. He answered questions following his talk.

The final speaker was Richie Taylor, Communications Director in the Arizona Attorney General's office. He discussed the intricacies of his role as a Director in the Attorney General's office and answered numerous legal-related questions.

This was an interesting and enlightening morning and underlined the complexity of government and the democratic process.


