Assistant Chief Deanda will speak about her current responsibility in her leadership role and share her story that led her to this key position.

So many decisions! Here's some help.

Proposition 139 - Arizona Access Abortion Act

AAUW Arizona has endorsed Proposition 139 which gives access to abortion to Arizona residents up to the "point of fetal viability."

CEBV Endorses Proposition 479 - No tax increase

This prop <u>continues a half-cent sales tax</u> for transportation, which has driven economic growth throughout Arizona by funding infrastructure improvements. It expands roads and freeways, reduces traffic and gridlock, and enables Maricopa County to invest in its transportation infrastructure to keep up with population growth. It will boost our economy and is projected to create 30,000 new jobs per year for the next 25 years. Unsurprisingly, it's endorsed by an enormous coalition of business, labor, community and elected leaders and organizations, including every mayor in Maricopa County regardless of political party.

AAUW Endorses Prop 486 - Arizona Expenditure Limit and Maricopa Community Colleges

In 1980, Arizona voters established an expenditure limit to restrict how much a community college district, including Maricopa Community Colleges, can spend even if funding is available. Much has changed since 1980. If passed, this will permanently adjust the base on which the expenditure limit is calculated to allow Maricopa Community Colleges to continue supporting students with high quality, relevant and affordable education. If this does not pass, Maricopa Community Colleges will be forced to cut up to \$100 million in expenses. This is not a request for additional funds, is not a tax increase, and does not get rid of the expenditure limit. According to Axios.com, Prop. 486 has no organized opposition campaign, and no one submitted arguments against the proposal.

CUSD Governing Board Candidates

Southeast Valley Branch has endorsed <u>Zeyna Pruzanovsky</u>, SEV Branch member, for the Chandler Unified School District Governing Board. She is a teacher at the Blackwater Community School with the Gila River Indian Community. She encourages us to also vote for <u>Claudia Mendoza and Barb Mozdzen</u> for the CUSD Board. Vote for the "z's."


